VC ASSURES ACRESAL ON NUTURING TREES SEEDLINGS TO MATURITY, URGES **FOCUS ON WILDLIFE** By: Lydia Legbo

he Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Faruk Adamu has assured officials of Agro-Climatic Resilience in Semi-Arid Landscapes (ACReSAL), of the University's readiness to nurture newly donated fruit trees seedlings to maturity. ACReSAL is a World Bank-assisted project co-funded by Niger State government for the reforestation of degraded wet land/semi arid landscapes with improved fruit trees.

Prof. Kuta gave the assurance during the handover and symbolic planting of fruit trees seedlings by ACReSAL and the University Management on Wednesday, September 6, 2023 at the Nursery Garden of the University's Department of Horticulture, Main Campus Gidan Kwano.

"We have the capacity. We have the know how. We have the manpower to actually ensure that these seedlings are nurtured and I want to give you this assurance that if not 100%, we will be able to raise at least 99 percent to maturity. With the facilities provided, you have made everything easy for us. All we need to do is to deploy the right manpower, " he reiterated.

While appreciating ACReSAL and the World Bank for the kind gesture, the VC stated that the assistance could not have come better than now as the University is proposing to establish the Department of Forestry and Wildlife. He therefore appealed to ACReSAL to enlarge its scope to include those animals that have gone extinct and pay supervisory visits to the University to see how these plants are faring.

Handing over the low hanging fruit trees seedlings and farm tools to the VC, the State Project Coordinator Mal. Usman Garba Ibeto who was represented by the State Environment Safeguard Officer, Mal. Raji Shehu Adam said that ACReSAL is a six-year plant restoration project assisted by World Bank, which covers 19 Northern states, including the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Abuja.

He added that the President of Nigeria gave the Federal Ministry of Environment a matching order to reclaim about four million hectares of land from now to 2030. Based on this order, he explained, each state is expected to reclaim

about 60,000 hectares of land.

According to him, the project has various components; component C of the project is to partner with educational institutions and for Niger State, the three selected institutions are; Federal University of Technology, Minna, Ibrahim Badamasi Babaginda University, Lapai and the Federal College of Education, Kontagora.

Earlier, the University's Director of the Directorate for Collaboration, Affiliation and Linkages (DCAL), Prof. Israel Olayemi disclosed that the VC has allocated a parcel of land for planting purposes and the University opted for economic trees, not only for economic and environmental reasons but also for teaching and research.

In addition to the fruit tree seedlings that will cover 60 hectares of land, farm tools, agro-chemicals and fertilisers, ACReSAL is also sinking 8 boreholes to ensure sustainability and survival of the plants in the University.
