Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, who, along with other principal officers, received the dignitaries at the Main Campus said the University was happy to note the important status Hon. Harouna, has attained in life.

He stressed the need for greater cooperation among West African countries.

Speaking during the event, Hon. Harouna who said that his wife is also an alumnus of the University, expressed happiness over the warm reception accorded them. He described FUT, Minna as one of the pillars on which he built his life.

"I am very happy to see what the University has become," said the lawmaker who expressed intention to visit FUT, Minna again.

All applicants must possess the basic entry requirements in addition to five O' level credits, including English and Mathematics.

Speaking during the visit, ACP Gwarzo who expressed confidence in the organization of FUT, Minna Security Division solicited for maximum cooperation of the University authorities at all times.

He stated that the Nigeria Police was directing its efforts towards community policing, which is the trend in most developed countries as there is little the Police can achieve on its own without cooperation from the public.

The Area Commander assured that their officers and men were being re-oriented towards having a people-friendly Police.

This agreement was reached during the signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the University and SEDI on Monday, May 23, 2016 at the VC's Conference Room, Main Campus.

The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Musbau Adewumi Akanji, FNSBMB, FAS, while speaking at the brief ceremony commended the Management of SEDI for collaborating with the University which has produced SEDI's two Managing Directors. He said the new agreement which is a direct move to play a major role in the training of skilled and innovative workforce is expected to positively transform the economy of the country.

Responding, the Managing Director, Engr. Mohammed B. Ndaliman said SEDI, Minna is happy with the signing of MoU as it will enable the institute play some role in concept development, sourcing funds for research and capacity building through exchange of experts.

He thanked the Vice-Chancellor for his advice and encouragement while praying that the MoU will mark the beginning of mutual benefits for both institutions.
